STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

- Age range - 18 to 48
- 66% female, 33% male
- Most students are from West Virginia.

OUR ALUMNI

- Job placement rate - above 90%
- Workplace settings include hospitals, trauma centers, outpatient clinics, and physician's offices throughout the US.
- The median salary in West Virginia is \$37,900 with more experienced professionals working in a small hospital setting earning as high as \$48,800 per year.

NATIONAL TRENDS

There is a shortage of Radiologic Technologists nationwide. Over 7,600 new Radiologic Technologists are needed each year in the US.

PASS RATES

For the past two years, our program has had a first time pass rate for the national ARRT examination for licensure above 94%.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- On-site, energized laboratory for students to use in making x-ray exposures on a phantom and a darkroom to process the images.
- Faculty and students attend the annual WVSRT Conference and participate in the Student Bowl.
- Students are members of the WVSRT and participate in an on-campus organization, Student Radiographic Technologist Association (SRTA).
