High School Scholarship Program

Earn up to a semester's worth of university credit at no cost during your junior and senior year of high school with Mountain State University's high school scholarship program. Here's how it works: After signing up for the program and being provisionally admitted to the University, you are permitted to enroll for free in freshman or sophomore level classes on a space available basis. For most courses, your only expense is for textbooks and supplies. You may take a total of up to 12 credit hours.

Once you have completed a course with a grade of C or better, the credit hours for that course are placed on hold. To remove the hold and have access to an official transcript of your HSSP coursework, all you have to do is enroll as a full-time student on campus at Mountain State University in the fall semester following your high school graduation. Once you have completed 12 credit hours as a regular student, your transcript will include both the hours you have just completed and those that you earned under the high school scholarship. You can apply the credit toward one of MSU's degree programs or transfer it to another college or university.

You must meet all prerequisites for the courses you enroll in; some courses may require a placement exam. You must also meet with a high school admissions counselor to register each semester. High school scholarship students are not eligible to enroll in independent study or program-specific courses, or in online or cohort programs.
