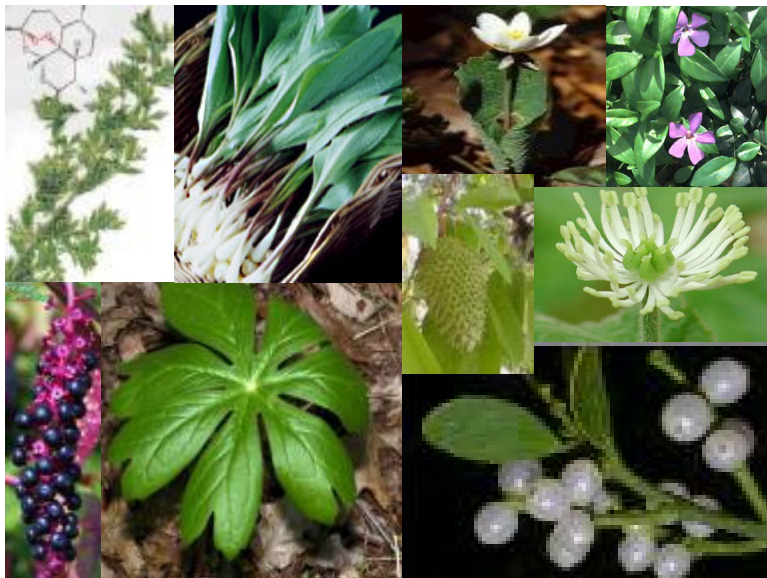

12:00-1:45 Dr. Jorge Ferreira, USDA, ARS, AFRC, will discuss *Artemisia annua* as a potential anti-cancer source. Dr. Ferreira's research has focused on the propagation, physiology, and biochemistry of medicinal plant compounds. Jorge's latest efforts have concentrated on evaluating *Artemisia annua* as a natural medicine to rid small ruminants (goats) of intestinal parasites.

2:00-3:45 Dr. Charles Arnett will talk about the use of herbs to combat HIV, malaria, and snake bites. Dr. Arnett practiced medicine in Nigeria for 15 years, and is experienced in treating infectious diseases in children and young adults with *Artemisia* and other herbs. Dr. Arnett is a retired and resides in Clarksburg, WV with his family. He remains active in medicinal mission work.
